GETTING IT DONE - HIGHLIGHTS FROM DEPARTMENTS

As you work on developing your assessment plans, check out these strategies from other departments:

In English, our practice of SLO assessment has been focused on identifying questions we have about our students and doing SLO assessment to find these answers. For example, when multiple measures was first introduced, the English Dept was interested in seeing how multiple measures might be affecting reading levels of students. We selected a level of English composition, picked the SLO about reading to assess, designed a quick rubric for this (basically decided what we meant by a scale of 1-5), and then assessed that set of courses using a common reading and essay question. We met after to look over the results and think together about what they meant.
