We need to consider how SLOs can be relevant to this work PSLO disaggregation might help. Business – doing a State training. Will modify SLO work and outcomes. Social Sciences – met w/ Paul Cheney to consult about ISLO map and course assessment. Reminder to faculty that the mapping is automatic – does not impact any assessment activity needed by faculty. SLOAC: Check your own rosters to spot check for any issues. Spring / Fall Planning: Moving the needle to continually development of assessment culture.	 Larger departments may need to have SLO assessment be organized at the individual discipline level. For departments that need to finish SLO planning, perhaps invite to a meeting and ask that they invite others who are relevant to join the conversation. The 3 year assessment cycle end will be good place to evaluate where we are and what areas are needing more support to move the needle on assessment. To move needle, may need representatives from areas that are not assessing regularly. Natural Sciences? Physical? CTE? Plan – identify representatives in spring and on-board in fall, with SLOAC committee member
