	Focus on Equity!!! Disaggregation data as way to get more people involved. Clean up of spring assessment schedules — feel free to send over info for DART that might be helpful. Cara will send out draft letter below — but how division reps message remaining courses is up to the division rep. Focus should be on momentum — keeping up the momentum in the dept is the priority. If we recommend assessing more frequently, focus on courses offered often, but also think about PSLO maps and what courses are actually mapped there too.
