ASSESSMENT CALENDARS

Assessment calendars are due from each department by September 15.

SLOS & COURSE SYLLABI

Be sure to take a second look at your syllabi to ensure that the SLOs that have been used were retrieved from eLUMEN, and not those on the COM website. eLUMEN has the most up-to-date SLOs for our divisions. Our online schedule is not linked to the course information in eLumen yet.

Also, be sure to send a copy of your syllabi to the administrative assistant in your area to double check that the SLOs on the syllabi match the Courses of Record (CORs).
